National and Local Recognition for the Society


The Marsh Creek Advent Church, Boggs Township, Centre County, was officially listed on the National Register of Historic Places by the National Park Service on November 21, 2022. Thanks to assistance with the nomination from consultant Jerry Clouse, the National Register recognizes that “the Marsh Creek Advent Church is as an important regional example of a meetinghouse plan church with Greek Revival style elements retaining a high level of integrity.”



The Centre County Historical Society also recognized the work of the Advent Historical Society on January 22, 2023, with a John H. Ziegler Historic Preservation Award for History and Heritage “for decades of commitment to local history through advocacy, research, documentation and preservation of the Marsh Creek Advent Church and its history. The Church was recently added to the National Register of Historic Places in November 2022 thanks to Barbara Franco and the Advent Historical Society.” The Advent Historical Society will also be added to a new edition of the popular *Centre County Explorers Passport* of historic sites and museums.

Home Folks Exhibit

A new exhibit, *Home Folks: Everyday Life in Holt's Hollow 1924–1945*, will open in the newly refurbished Barn Gallery during our Memorial Day event and will continue to be on display through the summer. Based on family photographs, diaries, and newspaper columns written by Emma Watson, the exhibit's nine panels cover the decades of the 1920s through the 1940s as well as recurring themes of farming, preserving the harvest, hunting, quilting, and the role of the Advent Church in the religious and social life of the community.

Featured musicians were guitarist Joe Pillott and State College Sacred Harp who demonstrated shape note singing, a unique musical tradition that would have been familiar to those at the Advent Church in 1849.
